Reading Instructions

For SoulCollage® Groups

Place everyone's Source Card in the middle of your group, face up.

Sit for moment with your SoulCollage deck; think of an open-ended question about a present life issue or a general question and write it down. [General example: *What Neters will be with me as I...?*] The more relevant the question to you and the more energy it holds for you right now, the deeper the reading will be.

Each person draws three cards without looking at them and places them face down in front of them.

Scribe (to the left of Card Reader) reads Card Reader's question (which has been passed to her/him by the Card Reader,) then is silent and takes notes for the Card Reader as (s)he talks.

Witness (to right of Card Reader) is silent, focused on Card Reader.

Card Reader, focusing on question, turns over one card, looks at it, names the card, if possible, and speaks as that card's Neter with *I Am the One Who...* giving it a voice, a point of view, speaking to the question. Letting her/his intuition bubble up with descriptive and feeling words. Being succinct. Speaking essence.

Facilitator (across from Card Reader) **listens, intervenes only to encourage Card Reader**, if necessary. The Facilitator allows pauses and silence when the Card Reader needs them. Doesn't distract, analyze, interpret, or probe. Only talks if it adds to or honors the person's own reading. Some suggested encouraging interventions, if needed:

What do you (the Neter speaking) have to say to the question?
What message do you have for (Card Reader)?
Could you speak from the Neter using I Am One Who?
Does that card feel finished for you for now?

All roles are passed to the left. The next Card Reader is the former Scribe and so on. The next Card Reader repeats the process above, until all at the table have read one card.

After completing the circle, then go around the circle again, each person in turn turning over the second card and reading it. Then the third card, repeating the process until all the cards from all participants have been read.

Then, the first Card Reader's Scribe reads back to the Card Reader what she or he said while reading all three of his or her cards. Then the Card Reader looks at the three cards as a whole, in relationship to the question they asked, noting patterns in the three cards as a whole (e.g., repeated symbols, surprises, paradoxes received from the reading.)

If you have thoughts about another person's reading at the very end, be sure to ask the person if they want to hear it right now, and allow them lots of room to say no if they do not want more input at this time, but would rather sit with what they have discovered themselves from their own cards.
